Wes Janz, architecture professor at Ball State University and guest curator of *small architecture BIG LANDSCAPES* has been collaborating on a global level with architects, students and people whose lives and

personal landscapes have been devastated by natural disasters or economic hardships, aiming to cultivate practical and local solutions for free or low-cost temporary shelter. Janz reveals lessons architects have learned from an ongoing dialogue with the most disadvantaged, yet determined people.

The exhibition includes large scale experimental structures inspired by indigenous materials and techniques; self

builder's tools from around the world; interpretive and documentary text and photographs; and related artworks including selections from the Swope collection.

Mr. Janz and exhibition participants will discuss the concept of small architecture Friday, February 5, at the First Friday opening reception and Saturday, February 6, in a round table discussion *small group of architects BIG PUBLIC DISCUSSION*, in the Mary Fendrich Hulman Gallery of the Swope, 1-2:30 pm.

An exhibition of complementary work by Wes Janz and his colleagues titled *Leftovers: Spaces, Materials, People* is on view January 21-February 17 at St.-Mary-of-the-Woods (reception Jan. 21 from 5-7:00pm).

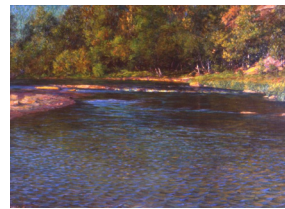
